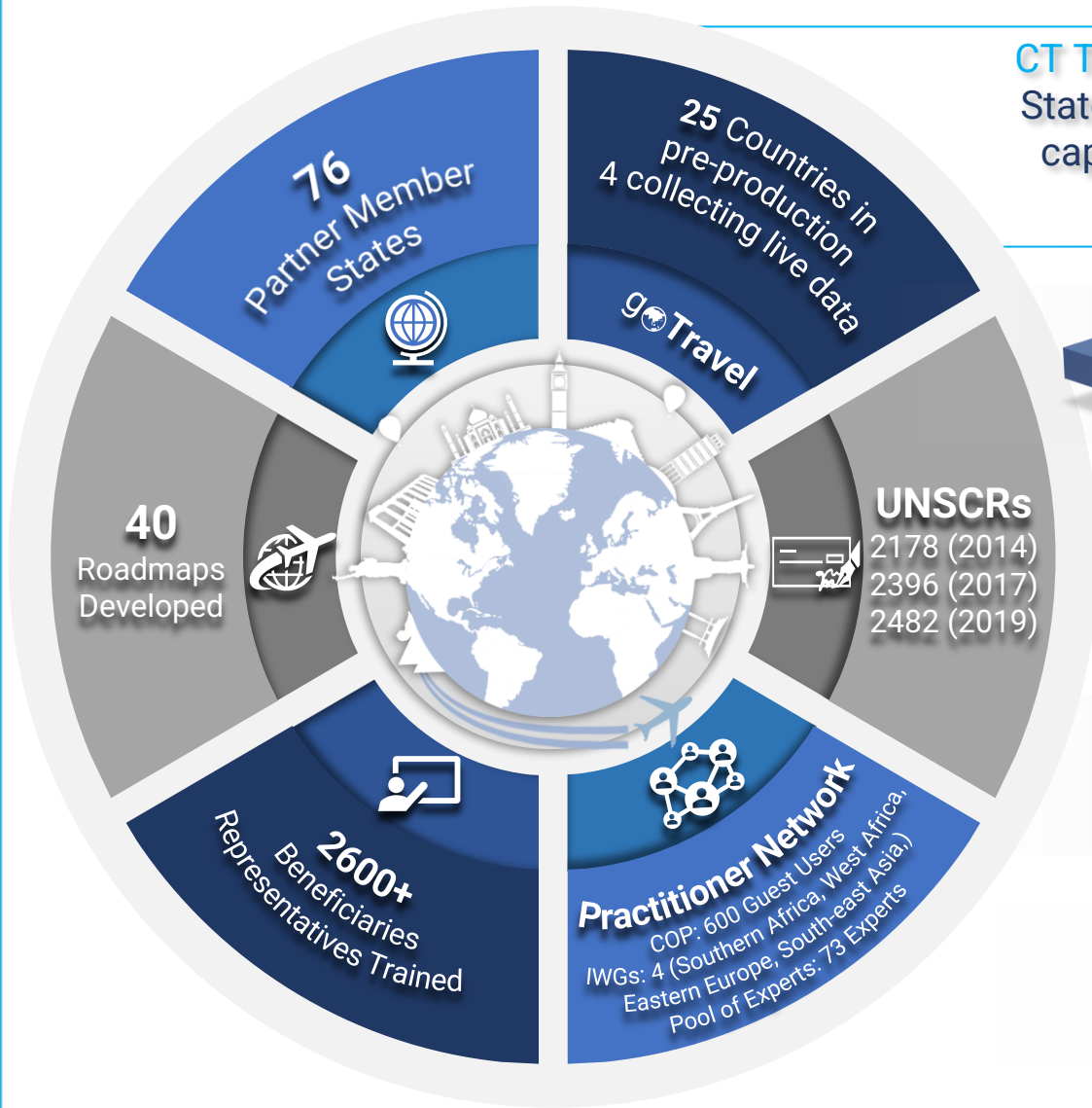

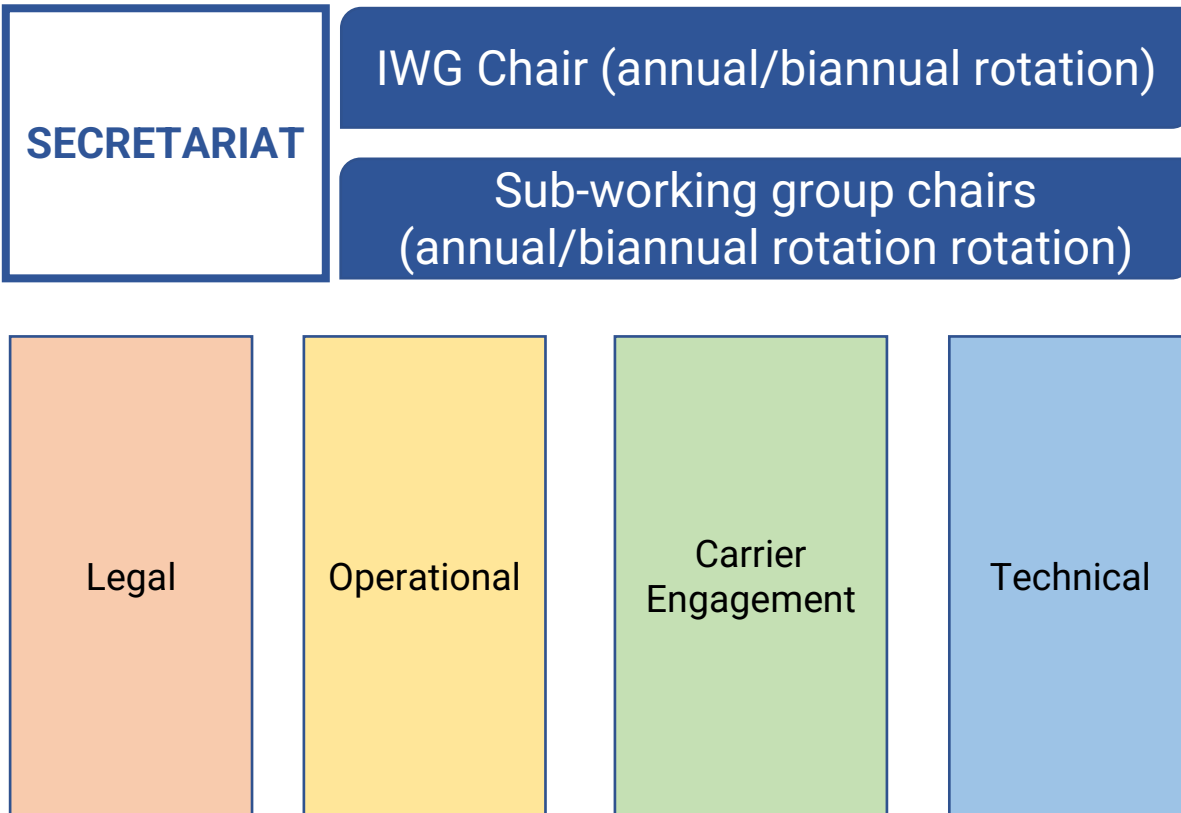
## OBJECTIVES

- ● ● ● ● ● **To focus** on API and PNR and other data collected from passengers from different travel modalities, including air and maritime
- ● ● ● ● ● **To support** comprehensive border management

- **2024 Activities:** Director-Level Coordination Meeting on Passenger Data Implementation in West Africa took place on 14-15 May, Abidjan, Côte d'Ivoire. The meeting gathered some 60 participants, including senior delegates from 19 Member States across West and Central Africa.
