Recommendation 12

- We are now transitioning back to normal compliance with SARPs
- Alleviations and CCRD system close on 30 June 2021
- All States to update TE (Targeted Exemption) Acceptability as soon as possible
- TE support from ICAO Regional Offices
 - where exceptional circumstances result in inability to return to normal compliance

What is a Targeted Exemption (TE)?

- Granted in exceptional circumstances as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic
- Temporary transitional option
- Require continuous monitoring



What is a Targeted Exemption (TE)?

- Pilot Proficiency Checks (PPC)
- Pilot TO/LDG Recent Experience (REC)
- Pilot Area, Route and Aerodrome Qualification for Pilot-in-Command (ARA)
- Pilot Medical Validity (MED)
- Pilot Licence Validity (PEL)



Alleviations & TEs – What's the difference?

Alleviations


- Temporary differences, exemptions and exceptions
- Applicable to all those subject to a regulation
- Submit using CCRD
- Part of EFOD

TEs

- Exemptions to specified Standards only (for ops conducted outside the borders of the issuing State)
- Applicable to a specific operator or defined group
- Submit using standardized TE form into TE List
- Not part of EFOD

Existing CCRD alleviation	 Plan for normal compliance with SARPs by 30 June 2021 Possibility for TE in exceptional situations
Exemption to regulation required with NO difference to SARPs	 File TE recommended using TE submission form (if it relates to the Standards listed on TE site)
Exemption to regulation results in a difference to SARPs	 File TE using TE submission form Create EFOD entry using standard text provided
Difference to Standards (other than those listed on TE site)	 Normal notification process (EFOD or paper submission)

CRRIC – New CART Recommendations

Safety CART Phase III NEW

REC.15 - Member States are urged to implement Addenda Nos, 1 and 2 to the Technical Instructions for the Safe Transport of Dangerous Goods by Air (Doc 9284) without delay in order to facilitate the transport of COVID-19 vaccines and to permit certain dangerous goods to be carried on board aircraft to provide for a safe, sanitary operating environment for passengers and crew, If any State wishes to be more restrictive, they are reminded of their obligation to file a State variation to the Technical Instructions.

Safety CART Phase III NEW

REC-16 - Member States are encouraged to consider the temporary lifting of restrictions to air cargo operations, including but not limited to granting extra-bilateral rights, in particular for all-cargo services, to foreign airlines to facilitate the transportation of essential goods, supplies and COVID-19 vaccines.

Public Health CART Phase III NEW

REC-17 - Member States should implement testing certificates based on the protocol, minimum dataset and implementation approaches outlined in the Manual on Testing and Cross-Border Risk Management Measures (Doc 10152) to facilitate air travel. States are encouraged to request evidence of testing that is secure, trustworthy, verifiable, convenient to use, compliant with data protection legislation and internationally/globally interoperable. Existing solutions should be considered and could incorporate a visible digital seal. This may be applicable to vaccination certificates.

REC-18 - Member States should facilitate access for air crew to vaccination as quickly as possible within the World Health Organization(WHO) Strategic Advisory Group of Experts on Immunization(SAGE) Stage III recommendations

REC-19 - Vaccination should not be a prerequisite for international travel. If and at such time as evidence shows that vaccinated persons would not transmit the SARS-CoV-2 virus or would present a reduced risk of transmitting the virus. Member States could consider exempting such persons from testing and/or guarantine measures, in accordance with a State's accepted risk threshold, national framework, the COVID-19 situation and the multilavered risk mitigation framework described in the Take-off: Guidance for Air Travel through the COVID-19 Public Health Crisis.

REC-20 - Member States should ensure that ICAO's CART guidance is taken into consideration by the wider State administration in the decision-making processes on national recovery planning.








Public Health Measures Implementation levels for EUR/NAT States

- So far, EUR/NAT States have reported 36% of the measures listed in the Take-off Document as Adopted.
- In average, States have not yet reviewed 57.6% of the measures.






CRRIC App for State Testing and Quarantine Protocols



- CRRIC App to report on the current status of Testing and Quarantine protocols established by States.
 - Data collected by ICAO through a survey on COVID-19 Testing And Cross-border Risk Management Measures (State letter AN 5/28-21/8 dated 29 January 2021).
 - State focal points to update and validate their State's information and keep the information upto-date (54% of EUR/NAT States have validated).
- The application also captures whether ^{1/5} quarantine and testing measures are waived or reduced if the traveler was vaccinated.



- This App helps build arrangements for a public health corridor between 2 or more States and/or a region.
- The App will provide information on the values for risk levels, routes, as well as public aviation health measures to be applied based on risk levels in order to build your arrangement.
- The adoption levels for the public health measures are drawn from the Public Health Risk Mitigation Measures application.
