- Special Assistance Team (SAT)
- Family Assistance Centre (FAC)

Family Assistance Centre





- Timely information & engagement
- Emotional support
- Access to and guidance on a range of agencies and services
- Seamless multi-agency approach
- Minimise duplication
- Enhance the level of support provided
- Avoid gaps

TUS Family Assistance Plan





- Responsibilities, roles, and procedures
- Coordinating with government agencies, local authorities, and other stakeholders
- Transport of associated friends and relatives
- Immediate economic needs payments
- Transfer of the passenger manifest
- Collaboration with accident investigation authorities
