# UPDATE ON DEVELOPMENT AND IMPLEMENTATION OF SEIs & DIPs RELATED TO RGS

(Presented by RGS WG Chairperson)

#### SUMMARY

The paper provides an update on the Safety Enhancement Initiatives (SEIs) and Detailed Implementation Plans (DIPs) related to Runway and Ground Safety (RGS). It also presents the status of aerodromes certification and establishment of Runway Safety Teams.

#### **1. INTRODUCTION**

1.1 According to ICAO data and the MID Annual Safety Report (MID-ASR), Runway Safety (RS) is confirmed to be the most frequent accidents at the global and Regional levels. Accordingly, RS remains as the first priority in the MID Region.

1.2 The IATA Safety Report for 2016 also identified Runway Excursion as one of its four primary areas of risk noting that these have accounted for the majority of accidents in the last five years. The report also notes the most occurring accident category for 2016 was Runway/Taxiway Excursions at 19%.

#### 2. DISCUSSION

#### Update on MID-RAST/RGS/2

2.1 The UAE is the champion of MID-RAST/RGS/2 which focuses on *development* guidance material and training programmes to support the creation of action plans by local aerodrome Runway Safety Teams (RST). The UAE has completed 100% of the DIP actions, as shown in **Appendix A**.

#### Update on MID-RAST/RGS/3

2.2 The UAE is the champion of MID-RAST/RGS/3, which focuses on *development* guidance material and training programmes to support Aerodrome Infrastructure and Maintenance Management. The UAE has completed 80% of the DIP actions and will conclude the remaining deliverable by end November 2018. The below paragraphs highlight the main actions related to this SEI.

2.3 In August 2015 the RGS WG provided ICAO MID a draft circular regarding *Aerodromes Certification Toolkit*. This document is based on the certification model used by the UAE and included model regulation, oversight processes and supporting forms for both aerodrome operations and rescue firefighting services. The circular was published by ICAO MID in September 2015 as RSA-05.

2.4 In April 2016 the RGS WG prepared a draft circular regarding *Guidance on Periodic Surveillance Audits of Aerodrome Infrastructure and Maintenance* which provides stand-along materials focussing on aerodrome safety oversight. This document is based on the experience and expertise of the UAE and includes model regulation, processes and supporting forms. The circular was published by ICAO MID in August 2016 as RSA-10.

2.5 **Appendix B** provides a summary of actions and planned actions related to the MID-RAST/RGS/3 DIP.

#### Update on MID-RAST/RGS/4

2.6 Egypt is the Champion of MID-RAST/RGS/4 which focuses on *Aerodrome Safeguarding*. Egypt is supported by the UAE and Sudan in the development and implementation of the supporting DIP and has completed 50% of the DIP actions.

2.7 RSC/5 meeting endorsed the publication of MID-RSA, *Safeguarding of Aerodromes*, which provides materials focussing on aerodrome safety oversight. The circular was published by ICAO MID in March 2017 as RSA-11.

2.8 Egypt will host the Aerodrome Safeguarding Workshop in Cairo from 4-6 December 2017 with speakers provided by Egypt and UAE.

2.9 Appendix C provides a summary of actions and planned actions related to MID-RAST/RGS/4.

#### Update on MID-RAST/RGS/5

2.10 Sudan is the Champion of MID-RAST/RGS/5, which focuses on *Wildlife Management and Controls*. Sudan is supported by the UAE, Egypt, Oman, Bahrain and IFATCA in the development and implementation of the supporting DIP, which is 50% complete further to preparation of draft Wildlife Management Control Regulatory Framework & Guidance Materials.

2.11 The draft RSA on *Wildlife Management Regulatory Framework & Guidance Materials* is included for endorsement as part of RASG-MID/6-WP/11 Advisory Circulars Related to Runway Safety.

2.12 Sudan supported by Egypt and UAE completed a draft Wildlife Hazard Management Plan Template. The Template will be reviewed by the RGS/4 Meeting (5-7 November 2017). 2.13 Sudan has offered to host a Workshop on Wildlife Management Control from 4-6 September 2018 in Khartoum.

2.14 **Appendix E** provides a summary of actions and planned actions related to MID-RAST/RGS/5.

### Update on MID-RAST/RGS/6

2.15 Egypt is the Champion of MID-RAST/RGS/6 which focuses on *Laser Attacks*. The Safety Advisory Circular on Laser Attack Safety Guidelines – RSA/12 was first issued and published by MID Office on March 2017 (SL. Ref.: ME 4-17/067 dated 29 March 2017).

2.16 A revised version of the RSA on *Laser Attacks Safety Guidelines* is included for endorsement as part of RASG-MID/6-WP/11 Advisory Circulars Related to Runway Safety.

2.17 Appendix D provides a summary of actions and planned actions related to MID-RAST/RGS/6.

### New SEI for Ground Handing Operations and Safety

2.18 RSC/5 agreed to the development of a new SEI, which focuses on *Ground Handing Operations and Safety* as MID-RAST/RGS/7 based on RGS WG/3 Draft Conclusion 3/5. The Subject is addressed in WP/7 (RSC/5 Draft Conclusion 5/2 refers).

2.19 Draft Conclusions on Adoption of ISAGO and IGOM for Ground Handling Operations and Development of Additional Ground Handling Operations Provisions were included for endorsement as part of RASG-MID/6-WP/7.

2.20 In the same vein a draft conclusion on Expansion of Runway Safety Programme (RSP) scope from the runway strip to the movement area (including aprons) is included for endorsement as part of RASG-MID/6-WP/7.

#### Updates on Certification of Aerodromes and Establishment of Runway Safety Teams

2.21 The meeting may wish to recall that RSC/5 reviewed the status of implementation of Aerodrome Certification and agreed that more efforts are needed to meet the target of 75% for year 2017.

2.22 Based on the feedback provided by States (up to 30 July 2017) and the amended AOP Table of the MID ANP, the aerodromes certification implementation table has been updated as at **Appendix F**. The table shows that 34 out of the 59 MID States' international aerodromes have been certified. This number represents 58% of the international aerodromes listed in the MID ANP which does not reach the MID Safety Strategy target for 2017.

2.23 The meeting may wish to recall that the RASG-MID/4 endorsed the inclusion of a new Safety Indicator "Number of established Runway Safety Teams (RST) at MID international aerodromes" in the MID Region Safety Strategy. The RSC/5 meeting noted that 25 RSTs were established, representing 42% of the required RSTs in the MID Region international aerodromes.

2.24 An update to the list of MID international aerodromes that established Runway Safety Teams is included in **Appendix G**. The table indicates that 33 RST were established out of 59 required at MID international aerodromes. The percentage of establishment of RSTs in the MID Region is 56% on 30 July 2017; noting the MID Safety Strategy target is 50% of international aerodromes by 2020.

2.25 With respect to the Procedures for the Air Navigation Services – Aerodromes (PANS-Aerodromes – Doc 9981), the RSC/5 meeting urged States and aerodrome operators to implement the provisions of the PANS-Aerodromes and to publish up-to-date lists of significant differences from this document in their AIP.

2.26 The meeting is invited to note that the Seminar/Workshop on the implementation of PANS-Aerodromes will be held in Cairo, Egypt, 8-9 November 2017, back-to-back with the RGS WG/4 meeting.

### **3.** ACTION BY THE MEETING

3.1 The meeting is invited to:

- a) note the progress achieved in the implementation of the DIPs related to MID-RASG RGS SEIs;
- b) encourage States to support the implementation of the RGS SEIs; and use the RASG-MID Safety Advisories, as appropriate, to enhance safety in the Region;
- c) encourage States to submit records of Runway Safety related accidents, with contributing factors, to ICAO MID Regional Office by end of each calendar year; and encourage;
- d) encourage States to participate in the Aerodrome Safeguarding Workshop in Cairo from 4-6 December 2017; and
- e) encourage States to participate in the Seminar/Workshop on the implementation of PANS-Aerodromes in Cairo, Egypt, 8-9 November 2017.
