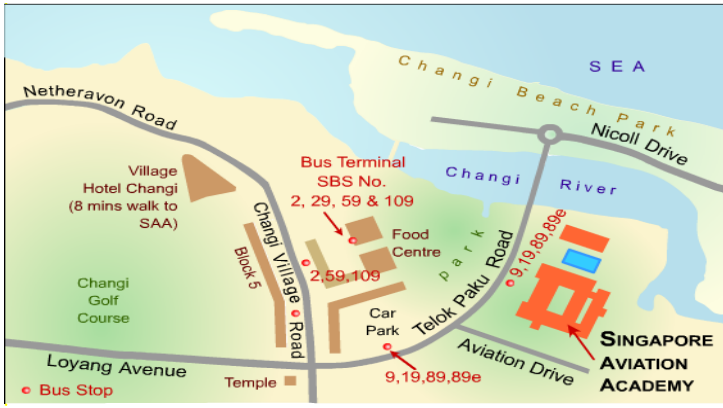
Venue of Workshop

To facilitate your entry into Singapore, please ensure that you have:

Valid passport with **minimum 6 months validity** at the time of departure

Visa for entry into Singapore (if applicable). Please visit [ICA visa requirements](#) for list of countries requiring a visa. You are required to obtain the necessary visa before departing for Singapore if there is a Singapore Overseas Mission located in your country.

All visitors traveling to Singapore should complete the [SG Arrival Card](#), up to 3 days prior to entering the country.

Personal travel/medical insurance to cover yourself for the period that you are in Singapore

Tax Refund

Transportation

Modes of Transportation

Singapore is well connected by Mass Rapid Transit (MRT), buses and taxis. The MRT system provides access to almost every part of Singapore. Train route map can be downloaded from [SMRT journey map](#). To complement the MRT system, the public buses bring you to many places island-wide. Public transport (MRT & bus) costs an average of less than \$5 per trip.

Taxis offer point-to-point transfers if you need to get to your

Modes of Payment

Cash, contactless bank cards or "Ez-link" card may be used for payment of public transport. "Ez-link" cards can be purchased from MRT stations, bus interchanges, 7-Eleven stores and SingPost outlets. Local practices and cultural norms

- Singapore is a cosmopolitan city and English is widely spoken, but the language close to the heart of every Singaporean is Singlish. It's a colourful slang that combines English and local dialects.

- Travellers may notice packs of tissue paper on tables at hawker centres. This is the Singaporean way of reserving a table while patrons are away to place their food orders. Refrain from picking up the pack of tissue and simply look for another table.

- Singaporeans queue for everything, so visitors can join the line and wait for their turn.

- Unless they are in a rush, visitors should always keep to the left when taking the escalator.

- Tipping is not necessary as most hotels and restaurants in Singapore impose a service charge of 10% on their goods and services provided. Most hotels and restaurants quote prices as "++", which denotes 10% service charge and 8% Goods and Services Tax (GST) on top of the total bill. Some restaurants may quote "+", which means they only impose either service charge or GST.

- The no-smoking law is enforced in most public places, including the outdoors. Travellers who need to light up should do so only in designated smoking areas, usually marked by a yellow box.

Currency and Services

Currency

The local currency is Singapore dollar (S\$).

Money Changing Services

Money changing services are available at Singapore [Changi Airport](#), most shopping malls and hotels. Automated Teller Machines (ATMs) that accept major credit cards such as Visa, MasterCard and American Express are conveniently located around the island.
