FAL2024: Practical Actions

Practical actions that States could take include:

- Publication of articles, infographics, videos, and social media content explaining the importance of air transport facilitation.
- Promotion of United Nations (UN) days relevant to air transport facilitation, such as the International Day of Persons with Disabilities and World Day Against Trafficking in Persons
- Development and/or offering of online and in-class courses on the role and importance of air transport facilitation or on facilitation-related topics for airline staff
- Promotion of biometric technology for seamless travel.
- Demonstrations of new facilitation technologies, such as digital credentials and government travel portals.
- Collaboration/promotion with ICAO, the UNWTO and global tourism boards.
- Collaboration / campaigns with disability advocates / influencers to promote accessible travel.
- Sponsorship of aviation-themed art installations in major airports
- Creation and submission of videos to ICAO to celebrate facilitation
- Publication of case studies showcasing the return on investment from facilitation initiatives

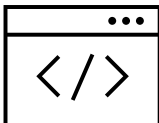

Air Transport Facilitation

In the context of international civil aviation, **facilitation** refers to measures to prevent unnecessary delays to aircraft, crews, passengers and cargo, especially, in the administration of the laws relating to immigration, quarantine, customs and clearance. The words "Facilitation of formalities" appears as a subtitle for Article 22 of the Convention on International Civil Aviation (Chicago Convention).

In September 1949, pursuant to Article 27 of the Chicago Convention, ICAO published the First Edition of Annex 9 – Facilitation that contained 89 Standards and Recommended Practices (SARPs). Over the years, many new and revised SARPs have been introduced through a series of amendments to the Annex that now contains more than 400 SARPs. These new and revised SARPs seek to address the evolving landscape of air transport; the contemporary needs of States, advances in technology, development of passenger and cargo traffic, and the

value of contributing to the continuing development of international civil aviation. Air transport facilitation can be linked to 9 of the 15 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) set forth by the United Nations (UN). Therefore, the work that ICAO undertakes to facilitate air travel is crucial to the world's economic and social development. Air transport Facilitation holds great importance for international civil aviation and will continue to in the years to come.



ICAO'S TRAVELLER IDENTIFICATION PROGRAMME (TRIP) STRATEGY: A Vital Enabler of Global Air Transport Facilitation

2024 is the ICAO Year of Facilitation.

Throughout the year, a variety of articles will be published raising awareness of the importance of air transport facilitation for a variety of aviation stakeholders and explaining the roles that different activities, tools and capabilities play in enhancing air transport facilitation.

This article explains the role of the ICAO Traveller Identification Programme (TRIP) Strategy.

an important aspect of international border security is ensuring that a traveller entering a passport and/or visa is the person to whom the document was legitimately issued. The traveller must also present reliable and verifiable information that uniquely identifies a traveller and can be used for identification. Efficient processing – a fundamental objective of **air transport facilitation** – furthermore ensures that the data can be read, understood, verified and processed in a timely manner.

ICAO has played a major role in establishing the best practices for the issuance of international travel documents. Standardization of document formats and contents has facilitated enhanced national security

by enabling nations to determine more quickly and accurately the validity of travel documents. Over the years, ICAO has issued specifications and guidance for the layout of the passport data page, size and shape of travel documents, and inclusion of security features, as well as for other aspects of travel document production and issuance.

Based on ICAO specifications, an issuing officer or border inspector can visually and electronically determine whether a document contains any of the security features (thereby reducing counterfeit or whether it might have been tampered with or photo substitution) when using those security features designed to be tamper-evident.

The ICAO Traveller Identification Programme Strategy was launched by ICAO in 2013 through a comprehensive international approach

The efficient and secure completion of border, immigration, customs and boarding procedures in international aviation – a fundamental objective of **air transport facilitation** – relies heavily on rapid and effective evaluation of travel documents. Those involved in managing the movement of travellers and crew through facilities need to check documents and ensure compliance with rules in a rapid and effective manner. Any delays in this process can hinder efficiency, have knock-on effects on timeliness and connectivity and reduce the economic benefits and sustainability of aviation.

Electronic and digital documents are an important foundation of modern-day facilitation. The data from

documents including electronic passports (ePassports) and electronic identity cards (eIDs) can be read accurately and quickly through contactless machine reading. By obtaining reliable data quickly and easily, processes can advance in a more efficient way than in the case of manual data provision, which is known to be error-prone. The new ICAO Digital Travel Credential (DTC) seeks to enhance facilitation even further by allowing for the provision of electronic passport data to be securely and safely shared with verifiers in advance of travel. With more checks being completed away from the border crossing point, facilitation can be greatly improved.

The data read from these documents is digitally signed at the time of issuance. Verification of the digital signature confirms the authenticity of the document and the integrity of the data read (i.e. that the data has not been altered or tampered with after document

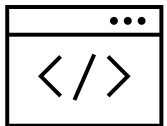
